Describe:

1. Describe in one or two sentences your experience/reaction to the movie "To Save A Life."
2. What was your favorite part of the movie? Least favorite? Anything you saw specifically that you had never seen or thought about before?

Interpret:

3. How did Jake, or any of the other characters *step back* (reflect on their life), *step across the line* (reach out), or *step up* (help others to live/see differently) in this movie?
4. What do you think was one of the most important things the movie was trying to communicate?
5. Which character did you identify with the most or at least in some way?
6. Which type of character from the movie do you have a hard time reaching out to? (i.e.: don't know how to approach the outsider, don't want to stand up to the jock...etc)
7. What cost did Jake have to pay for reaching out to the lonely or outsider? What cost would we probably pay if we did the same kind of thing? Is it worth it?

Transfer:

8. What truth do you understand now that you didn't before?
9. What do you think God is wanting to reveal to you personally through this movie?
10. What is one thing you can do specifically to ensure that what you've learned or felt from this movie will be a long-term change or commitment?
